Overview

The Canadian Public Pension Leadership Council (CPPLC) was established in 2013 and is dedicated to informing the evolving discussions about retirement income security for working Canadians. We are a group of non-partisan senior pension administrators and professionals from across the country who are focused on conducting research that supports predictable lifetime pension benefits for our members.

Member Plans

Eleven public sector pension plans from across the country are members of the CPPLC. These plans represent 1.9 million* members and over \$407.3 billion* in assets under management. The 11 member plans include:

Each member plan has a representative on council who elect two members from among themselves to chair the committee. Currently the CPPLC is co-chaired by Cheldon Angus, Saskatchewan Healthcare Employees Pension Plan, and Karen McKeown, BC Pension Corporation.
